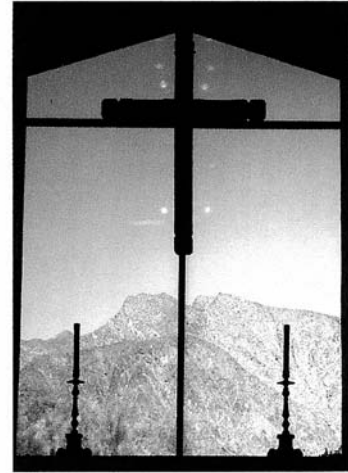

THE CALLING COMMITTEE OF ST. BARNABAS

The St Barnabas Calling Committee met at 2 PM, February 10th, in the Parish Room.

They were joined by The Rev Canon Jenny Vervynck of the Diocesan Clergy Deployment Office.

Jenny reviewed the items from the Power Point presentation she made to the Parish at the beginning of our discernment process and which have already been accomplished.

The next step will be a compilation of an updated parish profile, using the one done in 2000 as a starting point and including the ideas resulting from Jenny's last visit with the whole parish, along with suggestions that have since been received from individual parishioners.

Committee members will be checking the websites of other of our sister parishes who are currently in one phase or another of the calling process. Jenny suggested that we keep our own website current and pertinent as that will probably be the first thing a potential applicant would access. The Committee will explore the possibility of including Nancy Nagy's+ DVD of St Barnabas on the website.

At the meeting of the Calling Committee on February 16th, an outline was prepared of a current Parish Profile and each member accepted responsibility for preparing one component of that outline. Chairman Addis Ward distributed copies of profiles done by other parishes to be used as models for our own. Another resource will be the previous St Barnabas profile done in 2000.

All components will be brought to the next meeting on February 24th, when the committee will begin the actual writing of a timely parish profile. It is during this process when the ideas of individual parishioners as to what we should be looking for in our next Pastor will be incorporated.

We are pleased to announce that Trent Kleinkopf has graciously agreed to update our St Barnabas website. We've been told by both the Bishop and Canon Jenny that it will be the first place anyone thinking of sending us their resume will be looking. Please thank Trent when you see him and, if you're talented in such things, offer him your assistance.

The Committee will be meeting every Monday at 2:00 pm from now on. A resume of their progress will be written for the Carillon each month, always with the understanding that no information on individuals under consideration will be shared. This is standard procedure for any calling committee in order to protect the applicants' privacy.

With that exception, the Committee members stand ready to hear your questions, suggestions, whatever. We are at your service.

Rector's Corner

Signs and Symbols of the Season

The word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word, *lencten*, which meant springtime.

The Lenten season lasts 40 days (excluding Sundays) and recall the 40 days of spiritual preparation that Jesus spent in the wilderness as well as the 40 years the Hebrews wandered in the wilderness before coming into the Promised Land. In the early Church, Lent was a time for new converts or catechumens who studied and prepared for their baptism and first communion on Easter Eve.

The colors we use for vestments and paraments (altar and lectern hangings) are violet, signifying suffering and sorrow, and black, the traditional color of mourning.

Ashes, made from the burnt palms of the previous Palm Sunday celebration, are both a reminder of our mortality and a sign of our repentance.

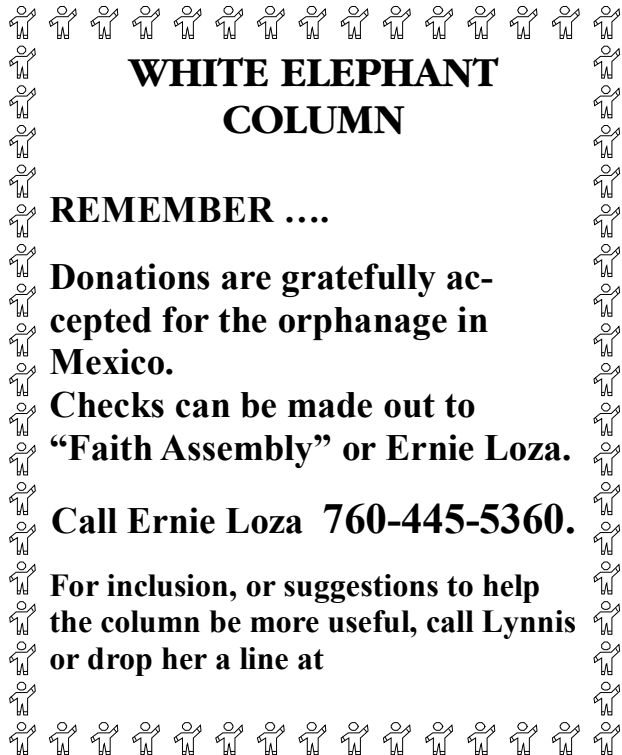
