ADVENT

For most churches in the Western tradition Advent is the beginning of the new Church Year and begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day. This year it begins on November 29th.

For children it is a time of excitement about Santa and presents. For us, too, it is a time of anticipation, expectation and preparation. The cry of hope first expressed by the Israelite slaves in Egypt as they cried out from their bitter oppression is sounded anew as we anticipate the reign of a Messiah who will bring peace, justice and righteousness to our world. Advent used to be a time of penitence, but it has gradually become celebrated more in terms of expectation. There is plenty of time during the Church Year to mourn and fast and remember our sins. Advent is a time of prayers for deliverance, of humble devotion and commitment. The word Advent means coming or arrival. The focus of the season is the celebration of the birth of Christ in his first Advent—and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. Come, O Come, Emmanuel!

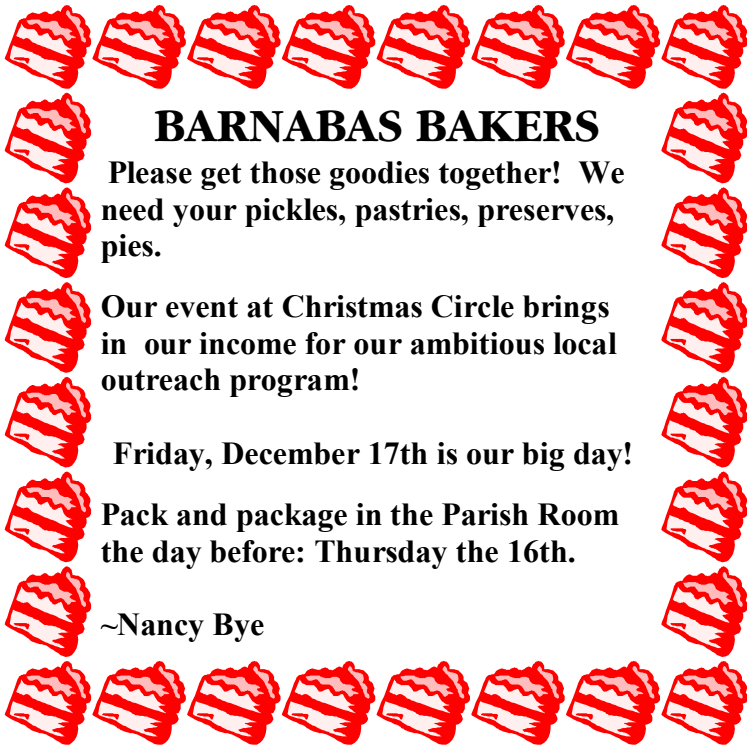

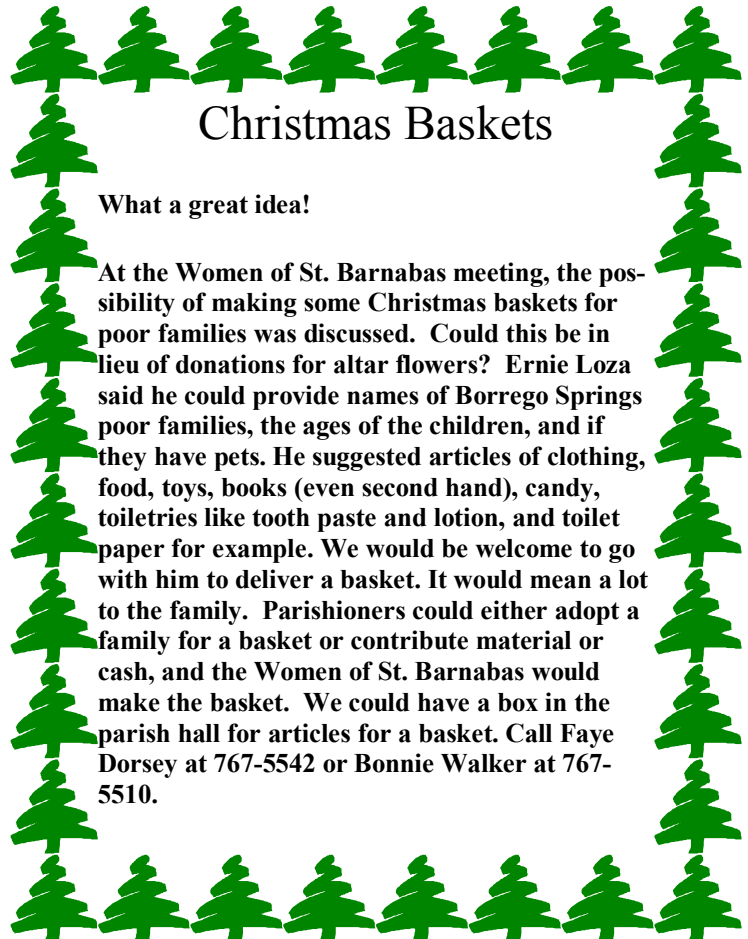
Talents and Treasures
